NO SALVAGING AT WASTE SITE

Council would like to remind all users of the waste disposal site that salvaging of any item from the waste site is NOT PERMITTED at any time.

STYROFOAM RECYCLING

All Styrofoam **MUST BE BAGGED IN CLEAR BAGS**. PLEASE DO NOT place loose items in this bin at the waste site. Clear bags are made available at the bin. You may recycle rigid material only and it must be clean and dry. Please remove all leftover food (and rinse), absorbent pads, stretch wrap, labels, tape, paper, attached plastic or metal.

Important*** Styrofoam is very costly to recycle and the attendant is continually finding loose material in the bin. If all material is not bagged, the entire bin is rejected by the company which processes it for recycling. If compliance by residents does not improve, the result will be the elimination of this recycling program.

SMOKE FREE ONTARIO ACT

Starting January 1, 2015, smoking is no longer allowed at public outdoor sporting areas, spectator areas, and public areas within 20 metres of any point of the edge of the sporting or spectator area. Effective January 1, 2015, smoking is no longer permitted on children's playgrounds or in public spaces within 20 metres of a playground.

This applies to the outdoor sporting areas and playgrounds located at the recreation park in Mallorytown. Signs have been posted and local public health units will carry out inspections and respond to complaints regarding smoking on and around these areas.

**IF YOU'RE
BURNING
GARBAGE,
YOU'RE
MAKING
POISON**



In an effort to raise awareness about the effects of garbage burning, Front of Yonge Council would like residents to be aware of the following:

Burning plastic, rubber or other man-made materials creates dioxin and other dangerous toxins in the air, soil & groundwater. **This endangers you, your children, your neighbours, your pets, birds and fish – with tumours, cancer, learning disorders, infertility, immune system problems, asthma, and other diseases. Children, teenagers & pregnant women are at the highest risk.** The resulting ash is also toxic and can easily get into the ground and into your well water. Dioxin and other chemicals are totally invisible, and their health effects are not immediate. It is easy to be unaware of the problems. But once you are aware, it doesn't make sense to continue. It may be hard to accept that the simple act of burning your garbage endangers you and your family but the longer you continue, the more poisons accumulate in your body.

Ideally, you shouldn't burn anything, other than for cooking food or heating your house. Burning leaves, plant clippings, paper, cardboard, and clean, unpainted, untreated wood is less hazardous than plastics – but is still not a healthy practice. **NOTE: A burn permit is required for all open burning including campfires and burn barrels.**
